


When used	<p>Situations that may cause significant structural damage</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tornadoes • Earthquakes • Severe winds 	<p>Eminent danger and/or threat of violent activity within the school building</p>	<p>Potential violent activity in the community or vicinity</p>	<p>When circumstances require students to leave the school building.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fire
Actions taken	<p>Students are relocated to the interior of buildings away from large open areas and windows. Students protect their head and face from debris.</p>	<p>Procedures are put in place to secure students in locked spaces while all access points to the building are shut down.</p>	<p>All students are brought inside the school building. All access points are locked and monitored.</p>	<p>Students exit the building through the nearest exterior door and meet at predetermined location for accountability.</p>

Talking Points for families ~

- Remind students that school is generally a very safe place
- Ask students to identify one or more trusted adults who will keep them safe at school
- Ask students to identify their role in emergency drills at school
- As a family, develop an evacuation/ safety plan for emergencies in the home
