Getting Started! The First Week of Kindergarten



ARRIVAL

- •Please try to send your child to school the way he/she will arrive throughout the year.
- •Staff will bring kindergarten students upon arrival to the cafeteria where they will be met by the kindergarten teachers to check in, and escorted to classrooms once everyone has arrived. We will gather all students in the cafeteria the entire first week of school and the Tuesday after Labor Day will be our final day. Starting Wednesday, 9/3, students will come directly to the classroom (we will teach them how).
- •Please note LES arrival and dismissal times. Students may enter the building at 9:00 and are considered tardy if arriving after 9:15. (9:16 is considered tardy.) If your student arrives late, he/she must be signed in at the front office by a parent/guardian.

Dismissal

Dismissal is at <u>3:45 PM.</u>

Expect buses to be slower with drop off the 1st weeks as we are diligent about double checking dismissal plans before having buses depart the school.

- Teachers will walk each child to his/her bus until he/she can do so independently.
- Changes in transportation require a note signed by the parent/guardian.

- If you are picking up your child before the dismissal bell rings, it is necessary for you to sign him/her out in the front office.
- Please wait in the front office for your child to be sent to you.





Communication

- •Each child will have a "Take Home" folder labeled with his/her name. You will receive this folder during our Open House this Friday, 8/22. If you are not attending Open House, it will go home the 1st day of school.
- •The "Take Home" folder will be sent home each evening and will contain important notices and completed class work.
- Please clean out the "Take Home" folder each evening and send it back each day.

- Notes to your child's teacher and completed forms should be put into the folder. An adult will check the folder each day for these items. This is also the place to put lunch money if you are not paying online (best option for K).
- Please be sure to read the Lisbon Lines (our school newsletter.) It comes out weekly on Friday from the front office.

Kindergarten Tags


This Friday, August 22nd is our open house for LES Kindergarten from 9:30-10:30 PM.

You will receive an identification tag in your child's Open House Folder requesting the following information: your child's name, school phone number, **PM Bus #** and **PM stop**. If your child does not ride the bus home, please note if they are attending an aftercare program or if they are a car rider.

On the first day of school, your child should have this tag attached to his/her backpack. These special tags help us identify our kindergarten students.

EXTRA CLOTHES

- Please send in an extra set of weather appropriate clothing for your child on the 1st day of school (shirt, shorts, socks, underwear). It will be kept in the classroom in the event of accidents, spills, or falls on the playground.
- Place clothes in a large zip lock bag <u>labeled</u> with your child's name and his/her homeroom teacher.
- Clothes will be sent home to be swapped out as the weather changes seasonally.
- Label all personal belongings with your child's name (coats, lunchboxes, water bottles). Many times students need help identifying which items belong to them. This also helps staff locate items lost.



CLASSROOM SNACK


- •We will have a daily snack in Kindergarten after 10:30 AM. Our lunch time is 12:15 AM.
- •Snacks must be sent **from home**. Due to known and possibly unknown allergies, we do not provide snacks to our students. Please also discuss with your child that we **should not share** snacks.
- •Send in <u>one</u> snack only. Snacks should be **dry finger foods** to avoid spills and should also be **free of** common **allergens** such as nuts. There may be classroom specific allergens to avoid that will be communicated to you by your child's teacher.
- •You may send a water bottle in with your child to use throughout the day. Please label the water bottle with your child's name. Juice boxes are not allowed at snack time.
- •Snacks should be sent in a separate bag/reusable pouch marked with your child's name and "Snack." This bag should then be put into your child's backpack, NOT their lunchbox. Talk to your child about what their snack is and where they may find it.

Lunch Pin Numbers

• Each student will have a PIN number to punch in when they get a school lunch.

 We will send this number home in the first weeks of school to practice this number with your student so lunchtime can go smoothly. Staff will help students especially early in the year.




Our Math Program

- 60 minutes daily, starting with a brief whole group number routine.
- Students are taught in small, flexible groups to help each child reach and/or exceed the end of year objectives.
- Our program works towards developing problem solving skills and the ability to verbalize mathematical thinking.

- We encourage students to use varied strategies to make sense of a task using their own reasoning.
- Our program is hands-on, manipulative based.



It may be helpful just to wear sneakers daily and to keep your child's book in their backpack when you aren't reading it.

Kindergarten Assessments

- **DIBELS Testing:** A reliable assessment for monitoring risk for literacy skills K-8th grade. Teachers will use this data to provide interventions for those students in need. After initial testing is complete, additional testing may be required for students to ensure that the instructional interventions are successful. All Kindergarten students will be assessed 3 times a year. Results are communicated in a report sent home after each assessment window.
- **KRA:** The Kindergarten Readiness Assessment is a tool used to evaluate a child's preparedness for kindergarten. These assessments help educators understand a child's current skill levels in math and reading as well as reporting on social-emotional readiness. The results inform teachers about a child's strengths and areas where the class or individuals might need extra support, helping them tailor instruction and create a supportive learning environment. Teacher will discuss the results with you.

Homework

- Begins in October.
- Optional for K per <u>HCPSS guidelines.</u> Pre-k through grade 2 have no more than 20 min nightly of hw.
- •Teachers will attach a monthly homework calendar in a journal and send it home. There will be a menu of activities to reinforce skills.
- •Turn in the HW Journal on Fridays. If there is no school Friday, please hold until the next Friday.
- We ask students to read for 10 minutes and practice sight words Mondays-Thursday.
- Please record any written responses in homework journals.

Report Cards & Grading



What is Standards Based Instruction and Reporting?

- 1. Outlines consistent standards to be taught, is focused on learning goals, and sets purpose.
- 2. Reports student achievement in reference to the standards they are taught with consistent scoring practices.
- 3. Supports all students in reaching the standards.
- 4. Progress is reported **compared to a standard -** not compared to other students.
- 5. Is equitable.

Kindergarten Open House

This Friday, August 22nd from 9:30-10:30 AM.

Make sure your family file is complete in HCPSS connect so your can view your child's teacher and know which room to visit.

What to expect:

You can **drop off your child's school supplies** on their desk. This will lighten your child's load on the 1st Day of School. Pre-ordered supplies are already in your child's classroom.

You will **check the name and spelling of your child's name** on their nametag. Teachers aren't always aware of nicknames, so touch base with your child's preferred name and pronunciation.

Make sure you take your child's Open House Folder. There is a lot of key information to get you started in K. Most importantly your child's bus tag that needs to be filled out and affixed to their backpack for the 1st day of school! Fill out the dismissal form so we know how your child is going home from the 1st day of school.

Go say hello to your teacher, introduce your child, take your welcome gifts and your Open House Folder.

Last, complete a simple scavenger hunt (parents should travel with their child) and finish off by enjoying a popsicle in the park at the front of Lisbon ES! Popsicles will be available from 10:30. Meet other incoming K students and families!




Questions

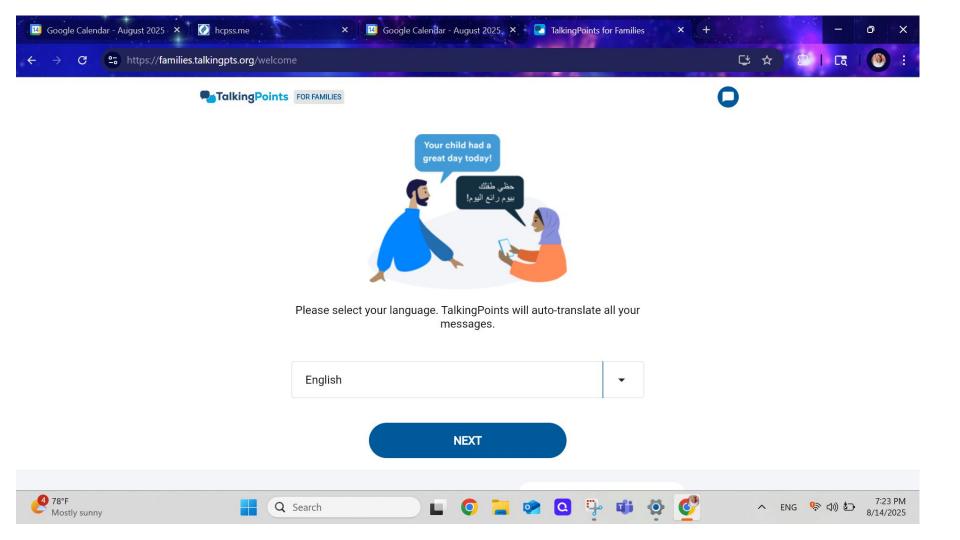
